Cascade Lake 4-H Camp Needs Your Help!

When 4-H volunteers and county staff from Southwest Idaho organized the Cascade Lake 4-H Camp in 1965, they understood the importance of camping as a valuable learning experience for youth and wanted to guarantee that a place would always be available for youth to learn while experiencing the wonder of a natural environment.

Over the years, many improvements have been made to our fifty-six acres of pine forest on the shores of Cascade Lake Reservoir. Loans have been obtained, donations sought and volunteers recruited to build and maintain the camp's facilities and amenities.

After 40 years of busy summer use, compounded by cold and snowy winters, there are many areas of the camp that are in need of upgrade and repair. The Cascade Lake 4-H Camp Board is now in the process of seeking financial assistance for update projects to ensure that the camp can continue to operate in a safe and comfortable manner for many more years to come.

Campaign 2010

The Camp Board has launched a new fundraising campaign called "Campaign 2010." Our goal is to fund current camp improvements and to build a reserve to finish the projects with incomplete bids by the end of the year 2010. Our goal is to raise over \$200,000 in three years through a combination of grants, corporate support, and individual contributions.

The Campaign Leadership Team, comprised of Camp Board members, former 4-H'ers, and other volunteers, plans to target private foundations, Valley County businesses, Idaho corporations, former campers and counselors, 4-H alumni, and parents. We have already received the donation of a much needed new milk dispenser. And one former 4-H'er has personally pledged \$1000 to help kick-start the fundraising efforts.

The camp website (www.cascadelake4hcamp.com) has been re-launched with a feature that allows people to make donations to camp online. We will be asking current and former 4-H'ers to donate whatever they can, whether it is \$5 or \$500 or volunteer time. You can also sign up on the website to receive camp updates via email.
