

2008 Policies and Procedures



We feel 4-H is the most exciting and valuable youth program around and are looking forward to having you join us at our camp! The "H's" of 4-H represent HEAD, HEART, HANDS and HEALTH. In following these beliefs, we have developed the following camp policies.

Everyone at camp must follow the list of rules below:

- ✿ Remain within camp limits. The limits are the lake, road and fence.
- ✿ Keep all areas of the campgrounds clean. Help protect the camp's facilities.
(Any camper damaging or writing on buildings will be charged accordingly.)
- ✿ Eat food provided and do not waste it.
- ✿ Report all injuries to the camp nurse. Turn in all medication to the nurse, upon arrival at the camp. Medications must be in original container with clear doctor's instructions on the label.
(Even aspirin, etc. needs to be handed in with a written note from parent to give permission and instructions on when it may be taken.)
- ✿ Follow the schedule and be on time to all activities and meals. Be quiet 15 minutes after the designated "lights out" at night.
- ✿ Always swim and canoe safely and only during designated times and when a lifeguard is on duty.
- ✿ Please leave the wildlife undisturbed. Fireworks are forbidden.
- ✿ Remember cleanliness. Camper's shower time is during free time or between 7 and 7:30 am
- ✿ Wear closed toed shoes at all times. To waterfront and showers, sandals are allowed.
- ✿ Dress in an appropriate manner. T-shirts and other printed clothing promoting the use of drugs or sexual behavior may not be worn at camp. Swimsuits must be covered when not being worn as part of a water activity.
- ✿ Wear name tags at all times.
- ✿ Respect privacy of others. Boys are not allowed inside girls' cabins and girls are not allowed inside of the boys' cabins. No sexual behavior will be tolerated.
- ✿ Keep music and radios quiet. Only appropriate subject matter and language will be allowed. No lyrics with violence or sexual connotations.
- ✿ Treat their fellow campers and staff respectfully. Swearing or language that belittles or harasses will not be tolerated. No rough housing or violent acts will be tolerated.
- ✿ No weapons (knives, guns, sprays, etc.) or any replica of such.
- ✿ Camp is a drug free area. No alcohol or illegal drugs are allowed.
- ✿ The Lodge is closed when Hashers are preparing it for a meal, and after Lights out.
